

Telehealth Medical Camp at Farmer Community Center (Ahmedpur Lamma)

FACE (Food & Agriculture Center of Excellence) at Rahim Yar Khan (APL) successfully conducted a 2 day Telehealth medical camp for the native population dated 11-12 Dec, 2019.

The camp used state of the art technology which allowed expert doctors to undertake medical services including Ultrasound and medical checkup using virtual environment for in-depth analysis and diagnosis of the patients. 200+ patients were accorded treatment by the 3 expert lady doctors managing the camp which included a large number of female patients. The camp also featured free of cost medicine to the patients as per the prescription of the conducting doctors. The initiative of extending quality healthcare and free of cost medicine was greatly hailed by the local community. FFC Special Project (Farmer Community Center) was joined by our health partners Global Initiative for Healthcare Quality (GIHQ) and COMSATS for successfully arranging the telehealth medical camp.

Non Formal School for Out of School Children's (OOSC) By Special Project (Farmer Community Center)

FACE (Food & Agriculture Center of Excellence) by FFC Special Project (FCC) at Rahim Yar Khan (APL) is working for the achievement of company's vision of a Food Secure Pakistan. Initiated in June, 2019 the program has engaged the host community with multifaceted program including sustainable agriculture, financial empowerment, social welfare services including education, healthcare, community mobilization etc.

In education, the first partnered Non Formal School (NFS) with Educate a Child (EAC) has commenced working from Oct, 2019. The school extends education opportunities to children who are unable to attain formal education. Based on the internationally acclaimed 1 room, 1 teacher model the school is operational with 30 enrolled students (mostly girls) at Basti Mairani (APL). Equipment including board, stationery, books, teaching material and sitting mats extended by EAC have been utilized for the establishment of the NFS.

For Out of School Children's, FACE completed household baseline survey with EAC having identified over 1200 children's in the area. Apart from the establishment of two more NFS, the OOSC children are being enrolled under formal schools in the area through collaboration with Education Deptt and local committee comprising of all stakeholders.
