

Tuberculosis Screening

Despite dramatic improvement in the sector, access to high quality TB services in rural areas is still a major breakthrough that needs to be achieved. Many people with TB remain undiagnosed or are diagnosed only after long delays.

Food Security and Agriculture Center of Excellence in collaboration with Indus Hospital Network arranged for a **Free 2-day Tuberculosis screening camp** at FACE Building in Ahmedpur Lamma RYK from 2-Feb - 3-Feb 2022. 3 x Male and 3 x Female Health workers conducted the camp on site.

The primary objective of screening is to ensure that active TB is detected early to reduce the risk of poor disease outcomes and the adverse social and economic consequences of the disease, as well as help reduce TB transmission in line with WHO guidelines. More than 150 patients availed the services.





Mother and Child Healthcare

Food Security and Agriculture Center of Excellence in collaboration with Indus Hospital Network arranged for a **Free 2-day Mother and Child Healthcare Camp** at FACE Building in Ahmedpur Lamma RYK from 2-Feb - 3-Feb 2022.

Free check-ups were conducted for local women and children of Ahmedpur Lamma. More than 120 patients including women and children showed up for consultation and medical inquiries at the camp site.

The local community admired the efforts and interventions carried out by healthcare professionals of FACE-APL in the region.





Population Control Camp

Food Security and Agriculture Center of Excellence in collaboration with Population Welfare Department GoPb arranged for a **Free Population Control and Healthcare Camp** at FACE Building in Ahmedpur Lamma RYK on 2-Feb 2022.

Mobile Service Units with Women Medical Officers conducted the camp and provided free family planning services and related counseling. Moreover, additional services included maternal and child health care and education on prevention and treatment of general ailments.

Around 130 participants from local adjacent areas benefited from the camp. The beneficiaries appreciated the efforts put in by FACE for the region.
